The City Commission of the City of Tatum met at a called meeting in the City of Tatum the 11th day of July 1963, and the following members were present:

Mayor	D. S. Martin
Commissioner	T. G. Hemby
Commissioner	Marcus Hardin
Secretary	Neal Mullins

After general discussion of entering into an agreement with the State Department of Public Welfare relative to Federal Old-Age and Survivors Insurance benefits Commissioner Hemby introduced for consideration of the City Council an ordinance. The ordinance was read in full by the City Secretary. Commissioner Hardin made a motion that the ordinance be passed. The motion was seconded by commissioner Hemby and was unanimously passed.

The ordinance as passed is as follows:

AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TATUM ACTING FOR AND ON BEHALF OF SAID CITY TO ENTER INTO ALL NECESSARY AGREEMENTS WITH THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WELFARE RELATIVE TO FEDERAL OLD-AGE AND SURVIVORS INSURANCE BENEFITS UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF APPLICABLE STATE AND FEDERAL LAWS; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE ALL SAID NECESSARY AGREEMENTS AND INSTRUMENTS FOR AND ON BEHALF OF SAID CITY COUNCIL AND CITY; DIRECTING THE SECRETARY TO MAKE ASSESSMENTS, COLLECTIONS, AND REPORTS; AND ORDERING THE ALLOCATION AND SETTING ASIDE OF SUFFICIENT MONEY FROM AVAILABLE FUNDS TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF SAID LAWS, SUCH MONEY TO BE SET ASIDE AND MAINTAINED IN THE REGULAR CITY DEPOSITORY AND TO BE KNOWN AS THE CITY OF TATUM SOCIAL SECURITY FUND:

WHEREAS, under the provisions of (1) House Bill 603, Acts 52nd Leg., R. S. 1951, and (2) Public Law 734, 81st Congress, ch. 809, 2d, H. R. 6000, incorporated cities of this State may enter into agreement with the State Department of Public Welfare and secure the benefits of Federal Old-Age and Survivors Insurance, as outlined in said laws: and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of this City Council that the extension of this Old-Age and Survivors Insurance System will be of great benefit not only to the employees of the municipality but to the municipality by attracting into it and enabling it to retain the best of personnel and thus increase the efficiency of its government; and it is deemed that the payment by the municipality of its portion of the cost of said system is a payment for municipal purposes.

WHEREAS, it is the desire of this City Council to authorize the making of any and all necessary agreements in order to secure the benefits of said acts; therefore BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TATUM, TEXAS:

1. That the City Council acting for and on behalf of the City of Tatum shall enter into all necessary agreements with the State department of Public Welfare for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the above-mentioned acts.

2. That Hon. D. S. Martin, Mayor is hereby appointed as Agent of the City Council and of the City to execute all necessary agreements and instruments for and in behalf of said City Council and City.


3. That the City Secretary Neal Mullins is hereby directed to be the person responsible for making assessments, collections, payments, and reports, as required by the State Department of Public Welfare.

4. That a sufficient sum of money be allocated and set aside from available funds for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the above-mentioned acts, such money so allocated and set aside to be known as the City of Tatum Social Security Fund, which fund shall be set aside and maintained in the regular city depository.
